What's Up on the Web?

As we mark the 6th anniversary of the September 11 terrorist attacks, the Wisconsin Historical Society web site offers an interesting, albeit bittersweet, look at the building of the World Trade Center structures from the point of view of sociology professor Richard Quinney who was teaching at New York University in 1969 during the construction of the towers. The site includes numerous color photographs taken by Quinney at and around the construction site as well as a link to an article by him entitled "110 Stories," that appeared in the Autumn 2002 issue (vol. 86, no. 1) of the *Wisconsin Magazine of History*. In that article, Quinney places the construction of the World Trade Center within the political and cultural contexts of New York City and the entire country at that time, and thus provides us with a different perspective from which to reflect upon the tragedy of September 11, 2001.
