### Admin Module Tip of the Month: Re-Direct the "Comments" Link

Until recently, messages sent from the "Comments" link at the top-right of the FirstSearch interface went directly to OCLC Customer Support. Patrons, however, may have assumed that such messages were sent to their library.

Now, you can re-direct the "Comments" link so that comments submitted by your patrons can be sent directly to an email address at your library. Here's how:

Log on to the WorldCat Services Administrative Module (formerly known as the FirstSearch Administrative Module) at <<http://firstsearch.oclc.org/admin>>.

Click the **Authentication/Access** tab.

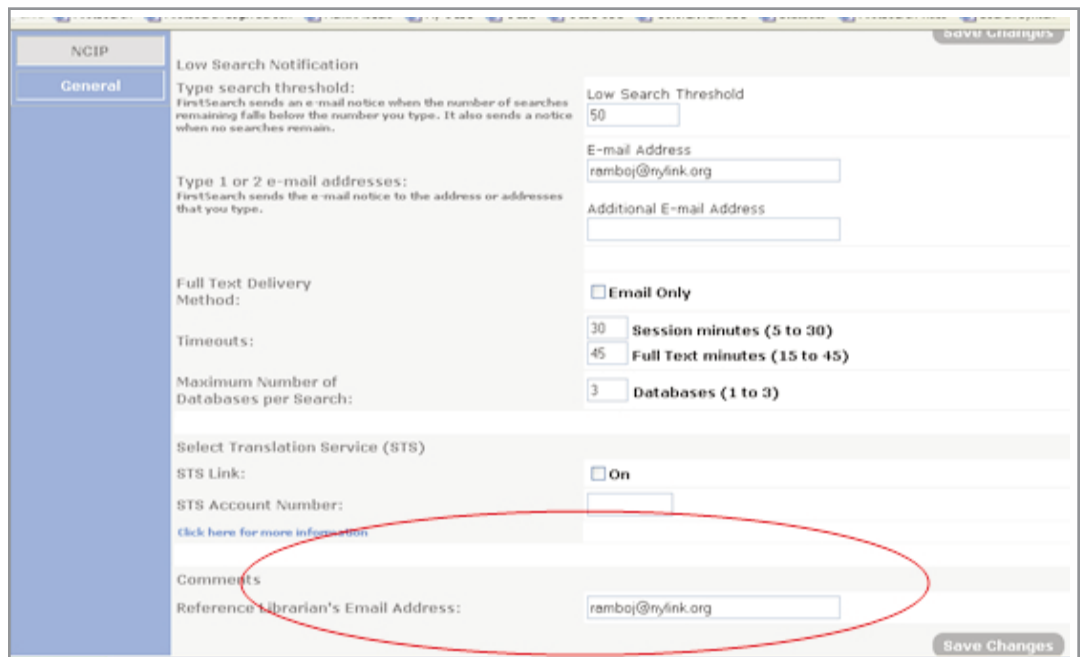
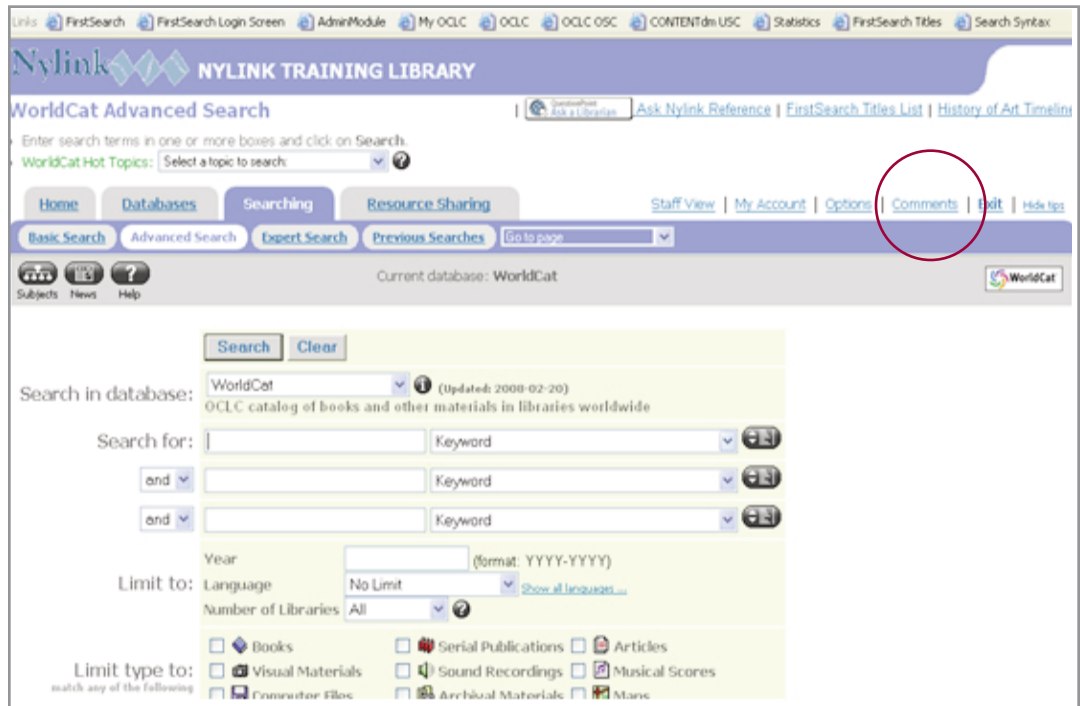
Click **General** on the navigation menu.

Scroll to the **Comments** section at the bottom of the page. Enter the e-mail address of the person at your library who has agreed to receive such messages.

Click the **Save Changes** button.

Exit the Admin Module.

According to OCLC, only comments that are self-identified as "I am a library patron" will be sent to the email address at your library.

### **WorldCat – Latin American RedALyC eJournal Collection Added**

Article-level records for more than 350 scholarly eJournals from Latin America, the Caribbean, Spain and Portugal are now available on the *WorldCat* database on FirstSearch and on WorldCat.org. These eJournals are provided by RedALyC, a research group from the Universidad Autónoma del Estado de México. RedALyC provides open access to a collection of peer-reviewed, scholarly science journals. All articles are full text. Records in WorldCat link to full text of articles on the RedALyC web site. Content in the RedALyC collection, which will be updated quarterly in WorldCat.

### **WorldCat.Org – Articles-Purchasing Option Added**

Research journal articles on *WorldCat.org* now include links to the British Library Direct service, where electronic copies of the articles may be purchased. British Library Direct offers pay-as-you-go access to 20,000 international research journals in many fields. Subject strengths include medicine, engineering, science, food and agriculture, economics, environment, law and education. Article text is delivered as a secure PDF document, typically within 24 hours, although 30 percent of articles are immediately available for download. Articles which cannot be downloaded on demand are offered with standard and premium options for delivery times. Links to the service are provided in the “Get It” and “Buy This Item” zones of a *WorldCat.org* record page. Approximately 4.6 million British Library articles are currently indexed on *WorldCat.org*.

*WorldCat.org* is testing links to this service. During its test phase, article purchase prices are displayed in Pounds Sterling (£), although credit-card transactions will automatically convert to the card holder’s home currency. U.S. Dollar (\$) and Euro (€) pricing will be available following the test’s completion.

### **FirstSearch Supports Internet Explorer 7**

FirstSearch now supports IE7 (and IE6). If you are using IE7 you will need to modify your pop-up settings so that wanted sites are listed as trusted sites.

In IE, go to: Tools > Pop-up Blocker > Pop-up Blocker Settings. In the area labeled “Allowed Sites,” enter “\*.oclc.org”. If you use RefWorks, enter “\*.refworks.com”.

Make sure the “Require server verification (https:) for all sites in this zone” is unchecked, otherwise you will get a warning “Sites added to this zone must use the https:// prefix.” If you get that message, uncheck the required server verification and enter “\*.oclc.org” again.

Next click on close and OK to exit the menu and close the browser. Now when you open your browser you will find export to RefWorks and other features work.
